## ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT USE OF PUBLIC STREETS FOR

## PEDDLING OR SETTING UP STANDS FOR RETAIL SALE.

## Effective September 31st, 1959

The Village of Martin ordains

That no individual, group of individuals, or company, shall use the public streets of the Village of Martin, for any purpose of selling at retail, farm produce, magazines, utensils, or any other commodity, EXCEPT, local farmers disposing of produce grown on their farms and organizations where the proceeds go for local or chatitable purposes, and then only by permit issued by the Village Clerk, or any member of the Village Commission, and if a stand is used for sale of products, it shall be placed in a location authorized by the Chief of Police before commencing operation.

Any person found guilty of the violation of this Ordinance shall be punishable under the law as follows:

1st Offense --- Fine of \$5.00 and costs

2nd Offense --- Fine of \$10.00 and costs

3rd Offense --- Fine of \$25.00 and costs or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

Any offender failing to pay the court-assessed fine and costs may be imprisoned not to exceed ninety days unless payment thereof be made sooner.
