ORDINANCE NO. 28 OF 1978

AN ORDINANCE TO CONTROL AND REGULATE THE PARKING OR STORAGE OF UNLICENSED, DISMANTLED OR PARTIALLY DISMANTLED MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MARTIN AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

The Village of Martin Ordains:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner, possessor or occupier of land within the Village of Martin, Allegan County, Michigan, or any person, firm, corporation, partnership or other association having charge of such lands to permit any unlicensed, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicle to remain on any land in the Village of Martin.

Section 2. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to unlicensed, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicles and parts thereof, including tires, stored within an enclosed building or in an open lot fenced with a six-foot-high, view-proof fence. Fencing, if used for the purpose of this ordinance, shall be made of material of uniform quality, have a straight or uniform patterned top line and be approved by the Zoning Administration or Administrator prior to construction; said fence to be kept in good repair by the owner.

Section 3. Nor shall this ordinance apply to operable vehicles on the premises of a business enterprise, operated in a lawful manner, when necessary to the operation of such enterprise, or to a storage place or depository maintained in a lawful manner by the Village of Martin.

Section 4. Unlicensed, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicles and parts thereof may be stored on or allowed to remain on the land of any owner or holder of land for a period not to exceed 14 days. Upon receipt of a special permit, the Village Clerk may approve not more than two 14-day extension periods.

Section 5. The Village of Martin, by the action of the Village Commission, may remove any such unlicensed, inoperable or partially dismantled motor vehicle or parts thereof after expiration of the aforesaid 14-day extension period or special-permit extension period.

Section 6. Any violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and any person, upon conviction thereof in any court of competent jurisdiction, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100 or by imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed 90 days or both fine and imprisonment at the discretion of such court. Each day that such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate and distinct violation of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective on the 15th day of February, 1978.
