THE VILLAGE OF MARTIN ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. That the Marshal of the Village of Martin designated by the Charter for the Village of Martin, as the Chief of Police of the Village and all other police officers of the Village of Martin, whether such individuals are considered appointed officials or employees of the Village of Martin, shall reside within the corporate limits of the Village of Martin.

SECTION 2. Residency defined: For purposes of this Ordinance, residency shall be defined as the bodily presence of an individual within the corporate limits of the Village of Martin with intent to make it a fixed and permanent home.

SECTION 3. Any individual, falling within the classification set forth in Section 1 above, shall maintain residency within the Village throughout his or her term of employment, provided further, that the failure of an individual to maintain residency as required herein shall terminate that individual's term of appointment or employment with the Village effective the date said individual ceases to be a resident of the Village.

SECTION 4. All Ordinance or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect MARCH 31, 1981, and published in accordance with Chapter VI, Section 4 of the Charter for the Village of Martin.
